Dear friends and neighbours of Hunt Club Community,

Another challenging month is behind us. Many of you were without power for a number of days, at its height, approximately 15,000 River Ward residences, following the May 21 Derecho event.

Every day was a fight to get local news and information from Hydro Ottawa. I was direct and assertive, writing to the CEO and even Chair of the Board, when my assigned contacts were not providing me what you needed – information.

There will be a lot to review about how Hydro Ottawa responded to this latest emergency. I am not critical of the men and women who worked in dangerous conditions to restore our power. My attention will be to provide input on the communications framework, criteria to prioritize power restoration, how to acquire needed resources faster and in greater quantities. We must also better understand how the power grid works, its vulnerabilities, and how investments can be made to strengthen it. Finally, at the very local level, how can we be more organized to serve each other in our times of need. This power outage lasted way too long. People needed help. How can we organize ourselves to serve one another before help arrives.

Tudor Hall Redevelopment

The City of Ottawa has received a Zoning By-law Amendment application to develop 2, 14 storey buildings and increase the sites maximum floor space index (FSI) from 1.0 to 4.8. The applicant also seeks approval to reduce parking space requirements from a total of 511 required parking spaces to 343 spaces. The relief from zoning provisions will permit the development of two 14-storey towers connected via a single storey podium, containing a total of 365 dwelling units. In addition to the 343 vehicular parking spaces, this development proposes 183 bicycle parking spaces and 2,190 square metres of amenity space. I am hosting a public consultation session to share information about the proposal, to facilitate a Question and Answer Session and to receive feedback on their plan:

All wading pools will be open on July 1 and August 1.

SPLASH PADS

The City of Ottawa Splash Pads will be in operation from May 21 until September 15 (weather dependent). Splash pad sites are unsupervised.

Wild Parsnip Strategy

The goal is to reduce the growth of wild parsnip in highly infested areas while ensuring that environmentally sensitive areas and public safety are not adversely impacted. In total, Council has approved \$298,000 for this year's strategy.

The 2022 Wild Parsnip Strategy will allow staff to:

- Continue and expand the application of Clearview and Navius FLEX herbicides to highly infested areas;
- Continue mowing operations, adjusting frequency and timing to best coincide with herbicide applications;
- Re-map infestation areas and levels;
- Continue the communication and awareness campaign in collaboration with partners in Ottawa Public Health (OPH), Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP), National Capital Commission (NCC), etc;

Wild parsnip spraying in City parklands will begin June 6, weather permitting. Approximately 935 lane kilometres of roadsides/pathways and over 200 locations of parkland will be treated this year. Roadside grass cutting will begin early June, and additional herbicide application may be considered again for the fall season.

Replacement of Aged Water Meters

The City of Ottawa has contracted Neptune Technology Group to replace 85,000 aging small water meters with new high-resolution meters. The three-year replacement project began, in August 2021, starting with wards in the downtown core and will slowly spread outward to the suburban wards as the project progresses.

The initial letters were sent out on May 6. In late May of this month Neptune Technology began replacing 5,872 meters in River Ward.

Water meters are the property of the City of Ottawa and require replacing after their lifecycle – which can be up to 25 years. As a condition of service, the City will be replacing these aging water meters to effectively support the delivery of drinking water to households and businesses.

Your new water meter will ensure continued accurate billing and enable enhanced online features through [MyServiceOttawa.ca](https://www.myserviceottawa.ca) including the ability to:

- View usage data right down to the litre – which can help detect even the smallest leaks
- Sign up for advanced leak and usage alerts

When Neptune Technology Group is ready to commence installations in your neighbourhood, you will receive information by mail that prompts you to book an appointment that is convenient for you, depending on availability – including weekends or evenings.

The installation time for a new meter is approximately 30 to 90 minutes and will require the water to be shut off by the Neptune Technology technician for a brief period of time.

Displaced Persons and Refugees Transit Pass Program

Displaced persons and refugees who have arrived in Ottawa are eligible for six months of free travel on OC Transpo.

The transit pass is a smartcard valid on buses, trains, and Para Transpo. The card is valid for six months from the month of issue. The card is accepted on STO. Para Transpo users are required to register with Para Transpo but will have temporary approval until their application is approved.

The transit passes are distributed by the Catholic Centre for Immigrants (CCI) and local settlement agencies.

To be eligible for Displaced Persons and Refugees Transit Pass Program, you must:

Be an individual / family displaced from your home country, having newly arrived in Canada;
Not be getting transportation funding from any other source;
Not be a Government-Assisted Refugee (GAR) or on Ontario Works (OW)

Break and enter prevention tips

As the weather warms up and we look forward to opening our windows and enjoying the fresh air, the Break and Enter Section of the Ottawa Police Services would like to remind you of some safety practices to reduce the risk of a break-in.

Keep your doors locked, even when you are home, to prevent undetected entry while inside or out in the yard.

Ensure ground floor windows are closed and locked before leaving the house or going to sleep at night.

Purses, wallets, and vehicle keys should be stored away from entry doors and windows.

Keep vehicles locked and garage door openers out of sight.

Install motion detector exterior lighting.

Keep garages and sheds locked when not in use.

Jewellery, passports, and other valuables should be stored in a safe or safety deposit box.

Keep an eye out for suspicious persons in your neighbourhood and report it to police immediately.

Don't wait to call police, even if you think it's minor.

If you're going away, don't advertise no one's home. Don't announce your vacation plans on social media and delay posting photographs until you are back home.

Tree Planting Operations

Postponed – Trees in Trust, Commemorative Trees, Schoolyard Tree Planting Grant Program, and Park and Streetscape Plantings

Unless planting took place before Saturday May 21, scheduled spring planting as part of the Commemorative Tree Program, Schoolyard Tree Plantings and Park and Streetscape Planting is now prioritized for fall 2022.

Extended – Deadline for Schoolyard Tree Planting Grant Program

We will be extending the application deadline for the Schoolyard Tree Planting Grant Program to October 1 (normal deadline is June 1) for project implementation in spring 2023.

Continuing –Tree Replacement Through Trees in Trust Program

Residents may apply online to have City-owned trees in front of their homes replaced through the Trees in Trust Program. The Trees in Trust Program plants City-owned trees on the right of way in front of residents' homes. We have seen many of these trees impacted by the severe storm. Staff are looking to replace those impacted City-owned trees located on the right of way. Residents may proactively request a replacement tree by completing an online form.

Starting – Tree Replacement in Parks

Parks Maintenance and Forestry staff are taking note of significantly damaged trees in parks and building a list to assess for replanting. Staff will implement those replacement projects in 2023 and beyond.

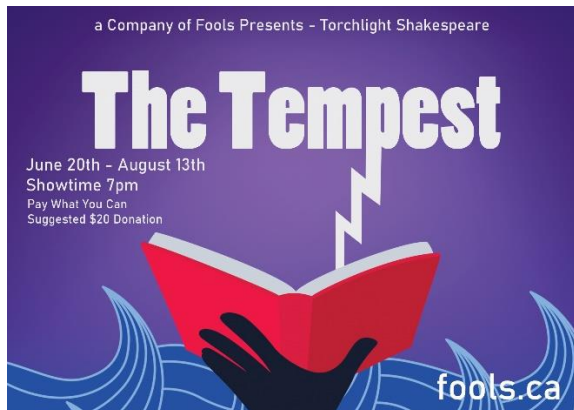
