Housing Affordability (15 minutes)

We had a zoom meeting June 21. In the meeting a map was presented with a specific proposal for our area. It would allow 2 units to be built on 1 lot. I support it. Motion: The Hunt Club Community Association supports in principle, up-zoning the present R1 zoning. The up-zoning would allow 2 units to be built on 1 lot.

Motion: To spend up to \$100 on a special meeting on up-zoning. The money would be used to print flyers and rent a room at the Community Centre.
