Subject: HCCA Recruitment poster

Audrey, Secretary-Treasurer of the HCCA, contacted the Board of Director with a recruitment poster she designed with Patrick (Director). Motions were presented requesting that 1) the poster be approved for the HCCA membership recruitment table at the Fall Festival, and 2) that it be approved for distribution/posting across the neighbourhood.

Motion 1

That it be moved for the recruitment poster presented (attached) to be adopted as an official recruitment poster of the HCCA in the fall of 2022.

Moved by Audrey Bélanger Baur, seconded by Patrick Morton, motion denied as only four directors voted in favour of the motion.

Some directors voted against motion 1 because they would like more time to review the wording before adopting the poster long-term.

Motion 2

That it be moved for a few copies of the recruitment poster (attached) to be made available at the HCCA recruitment table during the Fall Festival for consultation by residents.

Moved by Audrey Bélanger Baur, seconded by Patrick Morton, carried unanimously by all seven directors who voted.

John Sankey offered to print 10 copies of the poster for the HCCA table at the Fall Festival.
