City Budget 2023

The 2023 City Budget has been released and we will now commence a month-long consultation process that includes in-person and hybrid sessions, Councillor-led meetings, every Standing Committee, Board and Commission hosting meetings this month. This will come to fruition on March 1, when the Budget is expected to be ratified by City Council. I am co-hosting a community Budget session on February 7. In mid-January, I met with the Mayor, Acting City Manager and General Managers of Parks and Recreation as well as Public Works to discuss River Ward's Budget priorities: stable taxes, active transportation infrastructure, road paving, enhanced OC Transpo bus service, park amenity renewal, affordable housing and homelessness, as well as an increased focus to environmental initiatives, including lowering the overall GHG emissions emitted in our City.

February plans to be a very busy month. I am attending and hosting a number of events, please ensure you see the list below. Take good care and get outside if you can and enjoy our beautiful ward.

THE OTTAWA HOSPITAL PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION

February 9 | 6:30PM

The City of Ottawa has received a Site Plan Application for the Ottawa Hospital. The subject application includes both the third and fourth phase of the Master Site Plan consisting of a Central Utility Plant with electrical, heating and cooling equipment (Phase 3) and the main Hospital building (Phase 4). The main Hospital building will consist of approximately 230,000 square metres of gross floor area comprising a two-storey podium, two towers (Towers A and B) which will house the majority of the patient rooms, and a Pavilion flanking the Main Entrance. The Pavillion will consist of meeting and conference rooms, an auditorium, retail spaces, a cafeteria, and will connect to the weather-protected highline pathway across the top of the 4 storey parking garage. Ottawa Public Health Reminders

If you plan on visiting a loved one in a long-term care or retirement home, screen for symptoms, stay home if you feel sick, and if you feel well, wear a well-fitting mask during your visit. If you have any respiratory symptoms, remember to isolate until your symptoms have been improving for 24 hours and wear a mask for 10 days after the start of symptoms. Clearing Vents and Gas Meters – Cold Weather

A gas meter covered in snow or ice can impede its function of controlling the pressure of the gas supplied to a home, which could lead to serious risks. In addition, blocked external exhaust vents can cause the carbon monoxide (CO) emitted by fuel-burning appliances to build up in a home, which is also a significant safety hazard. Upon noticing a gas meter or external appliance vent pipe is covered with snow, please remove the snow carefully with a car brush or broom. Do not scrape the meter or vent pipe with a sharp instrument, as this may cause unintended damage.

Enbridge Gas reminds Ontarians of these additional safety precautions:

- Do not shovel, plow or blow snow up against the meter or vent pipe.
- Be careful not to bump your meter with a snow blower.
- Never kick your gas meter or vent pipes in an attempt to clear ice and snow.
- Remove any icicles from overhead eaves troughs to ensure dripping water does not splash and freeze on the meter or vent pipe.

Reduce Your Risk of Falling - Update from Ottawa Public Health

Anyone can fall. But as we age, our risk of falling becomes greater. The first step to avoiding falls is to understand

what causes them. Poor balance, decreased muscle and bone strength, and winter snow and ice can increase your

chance of falling. Staying safe and on your feet is a matter of taking some steps to protect yourself. For more

What started in a residential garage as one good deed, quickly became a humanitarian project that currently occupies a 10,400 square foot warehouse. House to Home's dedicated team works together both on site and behind

Snow Bank Removal

The safety of our residents is paramount, our city's Snow Operations team continue their dedicated work to remove

high snow banks and improve sight-lines to make roads safer for all road users.

Sawmill Creek Pathway:

After many years of discussion with the City, the Sawmill Creek pathway loop around the Wendy Stewart (Southern) Stormwater ponds are now winter maintained. The loop will be plowed on one side of the pathway for hikers/walkers and some room left unplowed to allow cross-country skiers access to that portion of the pathway as well.

Wendy Stewart Stormwater Ponds

The Wendy Stewart Stormwater Ponds are set to be dredged this summer. Proper functioning of the ponds requires regular maintenance, including sediment removal. The City of Ottawa will remove the sediment and dewater it onsite. The organic material is environmentally friendly and once dewatered, will be capped with soil and then seeded. I will host a Public information session in May for local residents to learn more about this project.
