Ecology Ottawa Pollinator Gardens

Memorandum of Understanding

- 1. Ecology Ottawa and <u>Hunt Club Community Association (HCCA)</u> ("the partner organization") enter into this memorandum of understanding concerning a future pollinator garden in <u>Paul Landry Park</u> ("the garden").
- 2. This agreement is effective from the moment of its signing by both parties until December 31, 2023.
- 3. Any deviation from this agreement is valid only on the express approval of both parties.

Ecology Ottawa's commitments:

- 1. Providing plants and supplies for the garden to a minimum of \$600, but up to \$2,350 (pending funding). All purchases will be made by Ecology Ottawa.
- 2. Publicizing the garden on its public channels, including social media and website.
- 3. Providing communications materials for community outreach, templates for signage to post on site, and translation assistance for these materials.
- 4. Providing administrative support for events at the garden listed in the below.
- 5. Providing on-going support for all aspects of the garden, including troubleshooting, expertise on plant care, any necessary discussions with the City of Ottawa and/or National Capital Commission, and so on.

The partner organization's commitments:

- 1. Obtaining permission from the body on whose jurisdiction the site lies to plant the garden. (Ecology Ottawa is willing to assist in this.)
- 2. Obtaining insurance coverage for all those who will engage with the garden, and collaborating with Ecology Ottawa to administer volunteer waivers, where necessary.
- 3. Recruiting community volunteers for as many of the below activities as feasible. (Ecology Ottawa is willing to assist in this.)
- 4. Preparing the garden's site in early May, including clearing and soil conditioning.
- 5. Planting the garden in late May, erecting signage identifying the garden and purpose, and identifying the plants within.
- 6. Holding an opening event in early June and inviting community participation.
- 7. Maintaining the garden through the summer, including watering as needed, weeding, and any other maintenance.
- 8. Hosting three site-visit days over the course of the summer, where the community is invited to visit the garden and the organization is on hand to provide information about the garden.
- 9. Holding an end-of-year event at the garden in late September and inviting community participation.
- 10. Participating in a year-end online event hosted by Ecology celebrating the program's successes.

- 11. Maintaining all equipment provided by Ecology Ottawa in good working order and taking all reasonable precautions to ensure its safekeeping.
- 12. Taking photographs of the garden and of the events listed above and permitting Ecology Ottawa to use them in their promotions and social media.
- 13. Discuss with Ecology Ottawa by late October best practices and lessons learned over the course of the year.
- 14. Notwithstanding the time limit imposed above, committing to the ongoing care and maintenance of the garden for at least two years following the program's formal end.
