- a June 6th Arts in the Park event at Paul Landry Park - **(postponed until 2027)**
- building and improving pollinator patch gardens planted around our community throughout the spring, summer and fall months
- removing invasive species (**Buckthorn Removal**) in parks and other urban natural areas in Hunt Club throughout the summer and fall months (**June 13th at Paul Landry Park, volunteer help needed**)
- a June 27th Old-Fashion Field Day Games and Picnic in the Park at Paul Landry Park - **(postponed until 2027)**
- participation in the ‘Play Music on Your Porch Day’ on Saturday, August 29th
- our annual Fall Community Festival at the community centre grounds on Sept 12th
- a Puzzle Exchange Party on Oct 24th at our community centre
- making up then distributing Holiday Hampers to those in our community who need this kind of support and cheer in the third week of December
